6.30pm: Festival launch event, Graiguenamanagh Library

Join us for our festival launch with whiskey tasting and entertainment by the Graiguenamanagh Men's Shed Choir and TV chef, actor and local author, Edward Hayden. Edward will perform a short snippet celebrating the best of John B. Keane from his recent sell-out show at the Watergate Theatre, Kilkenny. For his performance, Edward will introduce you to matchmaker Dicky Mick Dicky O'Connor and lifelong spinster Miss Fionnula Crust and regale you with six of their hilarious letters from Keane's *The Matchmaker*.

Join us for a meet-and-greet with Kilkenny author Niamh Boyce while also enjoying a gin tasting courtesy of Ballykeefe Distillery. Niamh will take us back in time to 14th-century Kilkenny with her latest novel, *Her Kind*. In 1324, Kilkenny heiress Alice Kyteler was accused of witchcraft and her maidservant Petronelle was burned at the stake. Niamh will read from her acclaimed novel and explore what inspired her to write about the Kilkenny Witch Trials. An instant success in its genre, Niamh Boyce's first novel, *The Herbalist*, is regarded as 'the most entertaining yet substantial historical novel since Joseph O'Connor's *Star of the Sea*' by *The Irish Times*. Boyce was the recipient of the 2012 Hennessy XO New Irish Writer of the Year accolade and picked up Newcomer of the Year at the Irish Book Awards in 2013. She was also short-listed for the 2011 Francis McManus Short Story competition, as well as the Molly Keane Creative Writing Award in 2010. Niamh's fiction is featured in such anthologies as Sinéad Gleeson's *The Long Gaze Back* and *The Hennessy Book of Irish Fiction 2005-2015*. *Join us for a gin tasting and cheese and wine reception.
